The goal of the campaign in Cornwall is to encourage local businesses to "paint the city purple" for the month, using purple light bulbs (available for \$10 at Cornwall Lighting, and through CANAA and a few other agencies), steamers, and any other kind of decorations. There will be a luncheon on November 3<sup>rd</sup> at Schnitzels to for local employers to gain more information about the campaign. There will be packages available with posters and window stickies so that different businesses can show their support for the campaign. This is the first year that Shine the Light is running in the area.
