

# Human Trafficking Workshop

Human trafficking involves the recruitment, transportation, harbouring and/or exercising control, direction or influence over the movements of a person in order to exploit that person, typically through sexual exploitation or forced labour.

It is often described as a modern form of slavery.

During this workshop, we will cover the following:

- The issues of human trafficking (including relevant legislation, different forms of human trafficking in the area of Ottawa and the surroundings.)
- Indicators of human trafficking to help trainees develop an ability to recognize it
- How trainees should respond to a case they identify as human trafficking and
- The OCEHT and what we do.

The workshop will be delivered by Sophie Faubert. Sophie has been a member of the Ottawa Coalition to end human trafficking for the past 3 years and is also the chair of the francophone outreach committee. Sophie has been giving trainings and presentations to professionals and members of the community for the last 3 years regarding Human Trafficking.
